HOSANNA IN THE HIGHEST

Dear friends and Parishioners,

We enter into full mysteries of redemption through the Holy Week ceremonies. The story, which begins of on Palm Sunday is our own story. I do remember the Palm Sunday in my childhood days, holding and waving the palms and moving around in procession through the town, a great feeling.... As Jesus enters into his final week, he takes humanity with him and continues his victory. We are not just remembering a historical event that happened over two thousand years ago. We celebrate and take part in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus as it happens today to us, and for us.

His entry into the city begins with a huge wave of optimism, joy and hope. The people line the streets; they wave palms, they put their cloaks and garments on the ground and they shout out his name. This was an ancient Roman tradition used to welcome soldiers and armies home after their success in battle. The crowd welcome Jesus in a similar way as they shout out, "Hosanna, Hosanna, blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Yet, how quickly the crowd changed from Hosanna to crucify him and turned on Jesus. Jesus is even betrayed and denied by his closet friends. The rest of them run and desert him. He is left alone.

The real danger that I can see is that we are so close to the celebration yet lost in the whole of Holy week. If we are not careful, we can lose sight of what we are remembering, celebrating and taking part in. Let us celebrate this great week with dignity and reverence. We also need to ask ourselves what it is all about and what it means to me as a disciple.

Where am I in the unfolding drama on Palm Sunday and that plays out over Holy Week and which climaxes on Easter? Where am I as Jesus passes by on the donkey? Am I one of the crowd shouting out his name? Am I like Judas in anyway? Do I deny Jesus like Peter, have I denied knowing Jesus? Am I like Pilate when I judge and condemn others? How am I like Simon or Veronica who help Jesus in his time of need? Having stood with the crowd shouting out his name and welcoming Jesus, will I stand with the same people spitting out insults as I shout 'Crucify him! Crucify him!'

As we celebrate Palm Sunday and begin our journey through Holy Week, we are called to ask ourselves who and where we are in the crowd. This is a week to pray and then decide what kind of disciples of Christ we are, and are going to be in this modern era.

During this busy week give some time and use this opportunity for you to let the seed of this Lenten prayer, fasting, and alms giving be fruitful through liturgies and ceremonies. Let us not lose sight of what we are remembering, celebrating and taking part in.

As we begin this most holy of weeks, may Jesus be our constant companion

What is the Triduum?

The Mass on Holy Thursday evening begins in the usual way but there is no blessing or dismissal at the end. Instead, there is a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the tabernacle. People depart in silence. The Good Friday liturgy begins with a silent procession, a period of silent prayer, and the opening prayer. It finishes with the prayer over the people. Again there is no final blessing or dismissal. Again people depart in silence, with a sense of 'unfinished business.' We gather in silence around the fire at the Easter Vigil before entering the church to celebrate the story of our salvation, welcoming new disciples, and celebrating eucharist before the joyful dismal: "Go in the peace of Christ, alleluia, alleluia." We are Easter people; people of hope and joy and our life of discipleship begins anew. Alleluia!

Holy Thursday, 28 March, 7pm

Holy Thursday marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the sacred Triduum, or three days. It celebrates the institution of the Eucharist, and the sacrament of the priesthood. After Holy Thursday, no Mass will be celebrated again in the Church until the Easter Vigil. Adoration, where we remain in the presence of the eucharistic Christ, follows Mass.

Stations of the Cross-Good Friday, 29 March, 10am

Whilst not strictly part of the Triduum, this is a popular devotion on Good Friday morning. We gather to pray and experience each step on Jesus' journey to Golgotha, and take our place in his rejection and death. At All Saints, our young people dramatise each station, adding a powerful visual to our prayer.

The Solemn Ceremonies of the Lord's Passion-

Good Friday, 29 March, 3pm The focus is the passion, crucifixion and death of Jesus. However, this is not an historical re-enactment. We are drawn into the paschal mystery in the present through the proclamation of John's gospel, the general intercessions, veneration of the cross and holy communion, so that it becomes part of our daily lives. This is not a Mass, so Eucharist which was placed in the tabernacle on Holy Thursday is distributed.

The annual collection for the Holy Land takes place as we leave the church. This money supports missionary, education, health, social welfare and the Holy Sites. Our help is needed more than ever in the land where Jesus lived.

Easter Vigil—Saturday, 30 March, 6pm

Easter Sunday, 31 March, 7am & 9am This is our night of night! We come together on this night to remember, celebrate and believe' the dying and rising of Jesus the paschal mystery in which we share by baptism and eucharist. Rich in symbol, story and sacrament this Mass leads us from darkness into the light of the risen Christ. Yes, it's longer than a normal Mass, but O, the beauty and the blessings are boundless! The celebration continues on Easter Day as we begin the seven week long Easter Season, ending with Pentecost.





Today is Palm Sunday, the last Sunday of the Lenten Season and the beginning of Holy Week. The liturgy is the most meaningful and stirring of Lent. The reading of the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ from one of the four Gospels is a beautiful ceremony. The celebration of Palm

Sunday with a procession around holy places probably originated in the Churches of Jerusalem, sometime before the third or fourth century C.E. When Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, crowds hailed him as the Messiah, waving palm leaves which they spread out in his path. The event is commemorated and told in all four gospels (Matthew 21, Mark 11, Luke 19, John 12). The significance of Jesus riding a donkey and having his way paved with palm branches is in fulfillment of a prophecy spoken by the prophet Zechariah (Zechariah 9:9). In biblical times, the custom called for kings and nobles arriving in procession, to ride on the back of a donkey. The donkey was a symbol of peace; those who rode upon them proclaimed peaceful intentions. The laying of palm branches indicated that the king or dignitary was arriving in victory or triumph. The crowds that went ahead of Jesus, and those that followed, shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Matt.21:9) When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?" The crowds answered, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee." (Matthew 21:1-3, 6-11) The people rushed to meet Him because of His miracles and fame. Palm Sunday is the great reminder of the events surrounding Jesus' death, but also heralds his glorification when we rejoice at his resurrection on Easter Sunday.
