The Secret of our Life

It's the pattern of loss and renewal that runs throughout our lives and our world. Even if you've never thought of this as the secret to life, you've lived and experienced it, sometimes by choice and other times by chance. Either way it's there.

What are the costs, the losses, you paid for an education or a career? You chose certain losses and let go of some things so that other things could arise. For every choice we make, every 'yes' we say, there is at least one 'no' and probably many.

This same pattern is in nature. You can see it in the changing of the seasons, falling leaves and new blooms, and the setting and rising of the sun. What in your life do you need to let go of today? What might you need to leave behind? What needs to die so that something new can arise?

You've probably had at least one time in your life that when you look back on it you say, "I never want to go through that again. But I wouldn't trade that experience for anything." What is that time for you? And you've got to know that dying is about more than our physical death. Yes, it is that but it's also more than that.

We die a thousand deaths throughout our lifetime. The loss of a loved one, a relationship, health, opportunities, a dream; all deaths we didn't want or ask for. Other times we choose our losses and deaths. We give up parts of ourselves for another. We change our beliefs and values so that we can be more authentically ourselves. And sometimes there are things we need to let go of, things we cling to that deny us the fullness of life we want and God offers: fear, anger or resentment, regret and disappointment, guilt etc

Maybe the thing I cling to, is my grain of wheat that needs to fall into the earth and die. That doesn't mean it will be easy. It just means that I want to trust Jesus' promise of new life more than my own desire. And, sometimes that's really hard.

Letting go, however, does not mean rejection or walking away. And it does not mean choosing absence over presence. Instead, letting go is what allows us to be more authentically present to ourselves and another. It makes room for new life and new ways of being present to arise. Our letting go gives God something with which to work.

This secret, this pattern of loss and renewal, will be unveiled everyday throughout Holy Week. I think that is why we hear this text today, a week before Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week. It's our preparation for Holy Week. And you know where Holy Week ends, right? At Easter, the empty tomb, the dawn of a new day, and the renewal of life. The single grain has become the Bread of Life.

But you also know that you don't plant a seed and go back in ten minutes or the next day and see a new sprout. Growth can be slow and the fruit of new life takes time, usually longer than we want it to. Yet, even when unseen, unbelieved, or unrecognized, the power and life of God are present and at work in the depths of our life, in the dark and hidden places. That's the mystery of life.

What is the Triduum?

The Triduum is best understood as one three-day-long liturgy. Or as one liturgy with three different moments (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Day) which move us from suffering and death, to new life. The purpose of these days is our participation in the paschal mystery through sacramental signs – foot washing, cross, fire and light, water and oil, scripture stories, the paschal meal – so that it becomes our way of being Christian in daily life.

Holy Thursday, 28 March, 7pm

Holy Thursday marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the sacred Triduum, or three days. It celebrates the institution of the Eucharist, and the sacrament of the priesthood. After Holy Thursday, no Mass will be celebrated again in the Church until the Easter Vigil. Adoration, where we remain in the presence of the eucharistic Christ, follows Mass.

Stations of the Cross-Good Friday, 29 March, 10am Whilst not strictly part of the Triduum, this is a popular devotion on Good Friday morning. We gather to pray and experience each step on Jesus' journey to Golgotha, and take our place in his rejection and death. At All Saints, our young people dramatise each station, adding a powerful visual to our prayer.

The Solemn Ceremonies of the Lord's Passion– Good Friday, 29 March, 3pm

The focus is the passion, crucifixion and death of Jesus. However, this is not an historical re-enactment. We are drawn into the paschal mystery in the present through the proclamation of John's gospel, the general intercessions, veneration of the cross and holy communion, so that it becomes part of our daily lives. This is not a Mass, so Eucharist which was placed in the tabernacle on Holy Thursday is distributed.

The annual collection for the Holy Land takes place as we leave the church. This money supports missionary, education, health, social welfare and the the Holy Sites. Our help is needed more than ever in the land where Jesus lived.


Easter Vigil—Saturday, 30 March, 6pm Easter Sunday, 31 March, 7am & 9am

This is our night of night! We come together on this night to 'remember, celebrate and believe' the dying and rising of Jesus – the paschal mystery in which we share by baptism and eucharist. Rich in symbol, story and sacrament this Mass leads us from darkness into the light of the risen Christ. Yes, it's longer than a normal Mass, but O, the beauty and the blessings are boundless! The celebration continues on Easter Day as we begin the seven week long Easter Season, ending with Pentecost.

"The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is a most beautiful gift from God – an opportunity we are given on a regular basis to be able to become a new creation and to strive to become a better person." These words by Fr. Richard Green OSPPE, are from the Lenten Program reflection for 26 February 2024. "Reconciliation allows us the opportunity to rid ourselves of the baggage that hinders us and to look towards a more positive future. We sin over and over again, but we need to remind ourselves of the love and compassion of God in this sacrament." The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) #1441 tells us "Only God forgives sin" (Mark 2:7) Since he is

to remind ourselves of the love and compassion of God in this sacrament." The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) #1441 tells us "Only God forgives sin" (Mark 2:7). Since he is the Son of God, Jesus says of himself, "The Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" and exercises this divine power: "Your sins are forgiven" (Mark 2:5; Luke 7:48). Further, by virtue of his divine authority, he gives this power to priests to exercise in his name. John 20:21-23: "Jesus said to them again. 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." CCC #1442: "Christ has willed that in their prayer and life and action his whole Church should be the sign and instrument of the forgiveness and reconciliation that he acquired for us at the price of his blood. But he entrusted the exercise of the power of absolution to the apostolic ministry which he charged with the "ministry of reconciliation." (2 Cor 5:18). The apostle is sent out "on behalf of Christ" with 'God making his appeal" through him and pleading: "be reconciled to God" (2Cor 5:20).
