Let's walk with God.....

Dear friends,

The most painful wounds we carry with us from the past are more wounds of the spirit than of the body. Of these spiritual wounds, the one that causes us most pain is that of a belief that we are insignificant. In this Gospel story, we hear in Jesus' words to the leper, his concern to heal the wound we carry with us from the past.

'Deeply moved, Jesus put out his hand and touched him.' Jesus, the poet of God's compassion, spoke in parables, but also in actions. He healed the sick and freed people from evil, brokenness and rejection. God's mercy was not just a beautiful idea. In Jesus, God is the active champion of the suffering.

Desire is important in life as it gives direction and momentum. The leper knew what he wanted and believed that Jesus had the power to grant it. He came in humility, begging from a kneeling position. Jesus met him with a compassionate response.

The church is again offering us the season of Lent as the practical application of his teachings before us from next Wednesday onwards. Ash Wednesday begins the Christian celebration of Lent. These days are of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to prepare believers for the celebration of Easter.

A part of Lent is the call to quiet and reflection. A call to still ourselves and consider our faith lives. We cease searching and striving for the external markers of success and fulfilment and settle in to listen to what the still, small voice of God is saying in our lives and in our hearts. It is an opportunity to ask ourselves: Am I able to hear the voice of God? Am I able to hear the cry of the poor? A time to allow God to touch us and heal.

Ash Wednesday marks the first day of the 40 days of Lent, in preparation for the great celebration of Christ's Paschal Mystery in the Easter Triduum. The late Henri Numen described Lent as a time to refocus and to re-enter a place of truth. It is here where we find our identity.

Ash Wednesday is the best way to begin a season, which calls us into self-examination as well as self-denial, into deeper contemplation about the mystery and grace of God's mercy, and towards more radical giving towards those most in need of comfort, sustenance, and hope.

This Ash Wednesday reminds us that we are mortal. It causes us to pause and look at our lives– remember what we are made of, remember where we are going- and encourages us to fully immerse ourselves in the Lenten season.

BIBLE JOTTINGS



Fasting is mentioned over 70 times throughout Scripture Both the Old and New Testaments teach the value of fasting, that is abstaining from food or drink in order to focus on prayer and seeking God's will. Moses and Jesus fasted. Exodus 34:28: "So he was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights. He neither ate bread nor drank water. And he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments." After his Baptism, Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness. Matt: 4:2: "He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished." Luke 4:2 also speaks of this. The season of Lent is now upon us, a time of preparation for the celebration of Easter and, in the words of an Australian Bishop, it is a time of grace and mercy, commemorated as a time for conversion, repentance and renewal, a journey where we are drawn more deeply into the mystery of life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Adult Catholics are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Australian Catholic Bishops, in 1985, decreed that Fridays throughout the year, including Lent, are not obligatory days of abstinence from meat provided an alternative form of penance is practised. The law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following: (a) prayer - for example, attending Mass, family prayer, a visit to a church or chapel, reading the Bible, making the Stations of the Cross, praying the Rosary; (b) self-denial – not eating meat, not eating sweets or dessert, giving up entertainment to spend time with the family, limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country; (c) helping others – for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened.
